START OF YEAR 2024:

School starts on Monday **29th January 2024**. The van will start its first pick up at 7.30am (Indee and then Kaleb), then will pick up Myah at 7.45am, Quinn at 7.50am and the Frith children by 8.00am. Meaning we should be at school by 8.30am. School will finish at 3.00pm so all children should be home between 3.30pm and 3.45pm.

Please ensure that all students bring togs and towel to school every day as swimming is part of the school curriculum and we will be starting this from day one of the term. Children should also bring along shoes for playing outside and taking part in sporting activities as there will be plenty of bees around at this time of year.

In addition to stationery children do need to bring a **WATER Bottle** (we are a water only school) and a **sun hat** to school each day.

Working Bee:

We are having a **WORKING BEE** at school on Waitangi Day - TUES-DAY 6th February from 9.30am (this is a public holiday so no work) and we would like as many parents,



whanau, past students and/ or their whanau, friends of the school to attend as possible.

We want to give the school a quick spruce up, tidying up gardens etc and it will be a great opportunity for new parents to meet other parents and our new principal; this will also provide a time for parents to talk about the school curriculum, charter, fundraising and other ideas.

There are plenty of things that need doing, so bring along hammers, tools, weed eaters, gardening tools etc. Our main focus will be cleaning out the lane, gardening / trimming shrubs etc and general tidy up around the playground and some water blasting etc. If you have a weed eater, chainsaw or ladder please bring it. Please provide your own PPE gear - we want you to be safe! If you can't physically help with the working bee you can still come along and provide support by helping with the lunch or watching children in the pool. Or, if you are unable to attend then, you could send along some baking to feed the troops. We will be providing a sausage sizzle etc at lunch time and the swimming pool will be open for the children, but only with an adult in attendance. Start time will be 9.30am.

SWIMMING:

ALL students are to take part in swimming, unless they have a genuine reason (accompanied by a note, or phone call, from home).

We are extremely lucky to have a swimming pool at Aberfeldy School and along



with our daily swimming lessons we will also be taking part in our Rural Schools Cluster swimming sports and other swimming opportunities.

SCHOOL VAN:

The school van fees remain at **\$25** per week for one student but will increase to \$30 for 2 students and



\$35 for more than 2 students.

These fees MUST be paid in advance so please look at getting these set up NOW-bank details are as below. We no longer receive MOE funding for the van so we need to set up a fundraising committee for the van, with all van users playing an active role in this.

As we have limited van seats, if your fees are not paid and kept up to date, your child will not be picked up.

SLIP, SLOP, SLAP:

Aberfeldy School is a Sun Smart school and students need to wear a sun hat when outside as per our Sun Protection practices -

We ensure that sun protection is considered for all outdoor school events and activities, on-site and off-site, including sports and EOTC. We try to plan outdoor activities to minimise exposure to the sun (UVR) during the summer (i.e. we consider timing and use of shade).

Students and staff are encouraged to make use of shaded areas when outside. Students eat lunch in the shade or inside, as appropriate.

We encourage students and staff to keep hydrated by drinking water.

We require students to wear hats that shade the face, neck, and ears whenever they are outdoors during school hours and/or activities, e.g. interval and lunch breaks, P.E., sports days, outdoor EOTC trips, and other school activities. Students at school without a hat must remain in an allocated shaded area or (if allowed) inside at break times.

We encourage students and staff to protect themselves with broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen of at least SPF30. The school provides sunscreen.

We encourage students to wear clothing that protects the skin (e.g. long sleeve tops, rash tops) when at risk of extended sun exposure (such as at sports days, school camps, and picnics), or when swimming outdoors.

encouraged to Staff are model appropriate sun protection practices.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION:
